Other credits include TABOO on Broadway, based on the life of Boy George and produced by Rosie O'Donnell. TRECO also created the role of Zanna in the off-

Broadway show ZANNA DON'T; Maroto in MIRACLE BROTHERS at the Vineyard Theatre, Simon the Zealot in the World Premiere of Robert Schenkkan's THE 12 at the Denver Center for the Performing Arts and The Stranger, a transgender woman in postapocalyptic America, in THE ROAR OF THE GREASEPAINT at Goodspeed. Gregory was a finalist on the WB competition show POPSTARS. TV credits include a guest-starring role on the CBS sitcom WHOOPI. Most recently, Gregory created the Choreography/Movement for the acclaimed short CELESTE starring Tony nominee Karine Plantadit; a film about a woman with ALS that opened the Brooklyn Beats film festival. As a writer he is currently working on a new musical, CHICKCHARNY and a feature film titled TALES OF A LIGHTSKINNED. TRECO received his BFA from the prestigious musical theater conservatory at Carnegie Mellon University and is the founder of stageRIGHTrecovery, a weekly gathering of Broadway artists centered around all types of addiction, launching later this year. stagerightrecovery.com @treco27 on all platforms! CAROLINE TYE, mezzo-soprano, is thrilled to be singing in the Lowcountry again! Raised in the Boston area, she has been visiting the Port Royal Sound area her entire life. In the 1960s, her grandparents moved to Hilton Head Island. Her parents reside on Spring Island. Having a career that covers multiple genres, from Opera to Torch Songs, she has been hailed as "sultry

and ambervoiced" as Mercédès in Regina Opera's CARMEN (Brooklyn Daily Eagle), as well as "stunning" for her performance as the Baker's Wife in Saint Petersburg Opera's production of Sondheim's INTO THE WOODS (BroadwayWorld.) Other credits include concerts with THE METROPOLITAN OPERA GUILD, numerous opera roles in the New York area (Bronx Opera) from composers from Britten, Poulence, to Wagner and Verdi. Caroline lives in New York City and is a longtime student of Lenora Eve.





TSHOMBE SELBY, tenor is originally from Manteo, N.C.; holding a Bachelors and Masters degree in both vocal performance and opera he has worked and studied for the past 10 yrs in NewYork City. As an usher at the Metropolitan Opera House his love for Opera and his musical ear were refined by the greatest singers and coaches in the world. In 2015 he made his solo debut at

CARNEGIE HALL in Stern Auditorium as the tenor soloist for the world premiere of "EXODUS" written by Earnestine Rodgers Robinson. In 2018 Tshombe was an emerging artist at Opera Nuova's festival in Edmonton Alberta Canada; sang Toni in the stage play, MASTER CLASS; and also sang the role of the first priest in THE MAGIC FLUTE. In that same year, Tshombe participated in the inaugural season of the U Artist Music festival in Kiev, Ukraine singing in concert with their presidential orchestra. 2019 brought his first opportunity to perform at the METROPOLITAN OPERA HOUSE as a part of the chorus for Wagner's GOTTERDAMMERUNG helping him to realize one of his biggest dreams. His next opportunity came as part of the now Grammy award winning ensemble of PORGY AND BESS, a production of the Metropolitan Opera with 10 nominations and a Grammy award! Since then, Tshombe has sung in Nine different productions including "FIRE SHUT UP IN MY BONES" and the Lyric Opera of Chicago where he covered a principal role. His latest accomplishment is in his first solo role as Mano in the new opera CHAMPION, at the Metropolitan Opera House.





AIMEE PILGERMAYER, soprano. After obtaining her masters in music from Peabody Conservatory, Aimee moved to NYC. She was then cast in the Broadway National Tour of THE SOUND OF MUSIC.
